Community Engagement at Melbourne - new policy and consultation reports available

Last summer, we spoke with community members of all ages and backgrounds about what public participation in city decisions means to them. More than 1200 people shared almost 3000 comments that helped inform the development of City of Melbourne's new Community Engagement Policy. Our consultation reports are now also available. Key themes that emerged from feedback indicate:

- People want more promotion about the projects Council is consulting on and they want to participate in ways that suit them
- All voices must be heard and valued
- People need to feel comfortable to participate
- Consultation must be genuine, transparent and clearly linked in action.
